<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Please exclude my student from all District/School Directories.</p>	<p>The Family Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) protects the privacy of all student educational records and requires that parents and eligible students be notified annually of their rights under the law. Under the provisions of FERPA, school officials may release directory information at their discretion without prior consent of the parent(s) or eligible student unless the parent(s) or eligible student elects to "opt out" and not have this information shared (see below). Eligible students are those students age eighteen (18) and older or students attending a postsecondary institution.</p> <p>Directory information: Information in this category is primarily for the publication of student directories. The intended distribution of these directories is to other students (and their families) attending your student's school. Student directories may include name, address, telephone number, e-mail, and grade level. In limited instances, this category may also include school related information that may be shared with the media or others interested in student programs. Examples include information about participation in activities or athletic teams, weight/height of athletes in some competitions, major fields of study, dates of attendance, most recent educational agency or institution attended, and degrees or awards received. Note: You will always be notified whenever student records are released to another school. Such requests usually occur when students are transferring to other schools or at time of graduation.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Please exclude my student from District Photo/Video</p>	<p>District Photo/Video Release: This category of student information includes student photographs in school yearbooks or newspapers, photographs and/or videos of students involved in school activities which may be printed in district publications/videos or posted on the district, school or class website, or district-sponsored social media sites.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Please exclude my student from Out of District Media</p>	<p>Out of District Media Release: On occasion, local news organizations work with the district to feature stories of interest about Olathe Public Schools. These media organizations may photograph or videotape students involved in school related activities.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Please exclude my student from all displays of Student Work</p>	<p>Exclude Display of Student Work: This category includes displays of artwork or other projects in school district buildings. Student projects or literary pieces may also be shared in district publications (print or video) and on the district or school internet sites. Occasionally, news organizations or other local, state, or national organizations may ask to display work by Olathe students in various formats</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Please exclude my student from the KCTC Student Survey</p>	<p>Kansas Communities That Care Survey: An anonymous survey measuring risk factors in Kansas communities in order to provide data for strategic planning for effective prevention services. (See attached notification for more detail.)</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Military Release Exclusion (High School Students only)</p>	<p>Military Recruitment: The Federal Government (Dept of Education and Dept of Defense), under the provisions of the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) and the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), requires schools to provide information about their students to military personnel. Specifically, this means military recruiters are entitled to the name, address and phone numbers of High School students. In addition, military recruiters now have the same access to students as colleges and potential employers.</p>

<input type="checkbox"/>	Please exclude my student from the Panorama Social Emotional Learning Survey	<p>Panorama Social Emotional Learning Students Survey Over 1,000 schools and districts use Panorama for Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) to grow and measure their students' social and emotional skills and supports. Social emotional learning captures the mindsets, skills, attitudes, and feelings that help students succeed in school, career, and life. For the Olathe Public Schools, Panorama for Social-Emotional Learning measures how students and teachers are doing on SEL topics and gives educators resources to infuse every part of the school day related to grit, emotional regulation, self-management, social awareness and self-efficacy. Your consent allows a brief 10-15 minute student survey to be given twice a year to measure students' perception of their skills in the five areas of grit, emotional regulation, self-management, social awareness and self-efficacy. This data will be reviewed at the district and classroom level to determine areas of strength and areas where more instruction is needed and/or skills practiced. Student individual data will be available to both students and parents.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	Please exclude my student from the AlcoholEdu Survey	<p>AlcoholEdu Survey: Health class, a module within Physical Education Concepts, is a required freshman course at your student's high school. Each student participates in an on-line tutorial entitled <i>AlcoholEdu</i>, which is an evidenced-based program that empowers teens to make sager and healthier choices about alcohol. <input type="checkbox"/>	Please exclude my student from Virtual Counseling Opportunities	<p>Virtual Individual or Group Counseling: The Olathe Public Schools will provide individual or group counseling if requested. This consent would allow your student to consult with a school counselor, school social worker, school psychologist, student wellness advocate or an intern under the direction of the aforementioned providers. These sessions could be in an individual or group setting. Should your student be recommended for group counseling sessions where other students would be present, more information would be provided to the parent prior to beginning the group sessions and parents would have the option to opt out their student from group sessions. Session topics may cover academic, college and career readiness or social emotional concerns. Record of all virtual sessions will be kept by the provider, sessions will not be recorded, and consent can be revoked at any time. This consent is also inclusive of individual virtual meetings with teachers during their office hours should your student wish to meet on an individual basis with a teacher.</p>
