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Course Description

Students will be able to converse with one another, ask questions about familiar topics, as well as manipulate simple language and situations in the target language by the end of this year-long course. This course will be taught in alignment with the ACTFL Novice Mid-High Proficiency Level Standards, as well as the Six Themes and Essential Questions outlined by the AP Spanish College Board. Students will listen, speak, read, and write Spanish in this course. Students will continue their study of grammar, idioms, vocabulary, customs, and culture in Spanish 2. To promote language proficiency, this class is taught partly in Spanish.
