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Course Description

This class at the Intermediate Low proficiency level increases students' language ability to function in social situations outside the classroom. Students use authentic materials to learn about and discuss familiar topics related to the Hispanic world around them. Students will listen, speak, read, and write Spanish in this course. Students will continue their study of grammar, vocabulary, customs, and culture in Spanish 3. To promote language proficiency, this class is taught mostly in Spanish.
