# Required classes:

- 4 credits of English
- 1 credit of Foreign Language/Applied Communication
- 1 credit of Fine Art—visual or performing
- 3 credits of Social Science
  - World History (freshman)
  - .5 Social Science Elective (sophomore)
  - U. S. History (junior)
  - Government (.5 senior)



- 3 credits of Math
- 3 credits of Science—one Life Science, one Physical Science
- .5 credit of Technology
- 1 credit of Practical and Consumer Studies
- .5 credit of Consumer & Personal Finance
- 1 credit of Health & Wellness
- 6 Individual Focus Credits
- 24 TOTAL credits are required to graduate
- Opportunity to earn 28 (7 credits year/4 years)



# WHAT IS GPA?

Grade Point Average
Represents average of grades earned
Used to determine class rank
Have 6 semesters to build your GPA

- -A = 4 points
- -B = 3 points
- C = 2 points
- D = 1 point
- F = no points

# MEETING GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Must get a passing grade to earn credit
- D (60% or higher) is considered a passing grade
- Once an "F" is earned it becomes a permanent part of your transcript
  - Core classes and Consumer Personal Finance are courses that MUST be made up through our credit recovery program IF an "F" is earned
- Please see your counselor for credit recovery options

# KANSAS BOARD OF REGENTS COLLEGE ADMISSION STANDARDS

What are Qualified Admissions? Qualified Admissions (QA) are a set of standards used by the six state universities to review applicants for undergraduate admission. The universities that use QA are Emporia State University, Fort Hays State University, Kansas State University, Pittsburg State University, the University of Kansas, and Wichita State University. These standards are set by the Kansas Board of Regents, the governing body for the state universities. It is important to note that our Olathe Graduation Requirements must be met to graduate from Olathe Public Schools. Please consult your student's school counselor with any questions.

What are the Qualified Admissions standards? At its September 18, 2019 meeting, the Kansas Board of Regents (Board) approved amendments to the Qualified Admissions (QA) criteria. The new Qualified Admissions standards are below.

- ACT 16 or above OR SAT–800 or above
- Must meet minimum annual requirements

- ACT/SAT Required

- Transportation provided to and from South (am only)
- 2 year certification will not be awarded for one year of participation


