CURRENT CHALLENGES

Number of routes = 182

Number of drivers = 150

Current driver shortage = -32

*covered by office staff, substitute drivers, and Assisted Transportation



CURRENT REALITY DUE TO THE DRIVER SHORTAGE

- Rolling Blackouts for Payride Bus Routes unable to staff all routes.
- Middle School & High School students combined on the same bus.
- One driver serving more than one bus route for the same school.
- Extended ride time for students at all levels.
- Routes at higher capacities requiring 3 students per seat.
 - HS 19 over standard capacity (49)
 - MS 13 over standard capacity (55)
 - ES 7 over standard capacity (60)



CURRENT REALITY DUE TO THE DRIVER SHORTAGE (PART 2)

- Eligible students on a wait list for several schools, some in safety variance areas.
- Assisted Transportation covering 22 GenEd & SpEd routes at a premium cost.
- No driver availability for out-of-town trips such as college visits, enrichment, or state tournaments/festivals.
- Students required to leave school earlier than necessary for athletic trips.
- Limited availability to serve McKinney-Vento and Foster students residing outside OPS boundary.



POSSIBLE INTERVENTIONS

Eliminate:

- 1. Payride program
- 2. Transportation for 21st CHSA's
- 3. District safety variances
- 4. Transportation for Head Start and Jump Start
- 5. Continue/expand the rolling blackouts
- 6. Extend walking distance to bus stops for HS and MS students
- 7. Explore a bell schedule adjustment to create a 3-tier system


COUNT OF WHAT IS THE EARLIEST AND LATEST DISMISSAL TIME YOU WOULD SUPPORT?

FEEDBACK SUMMARY

•The following 2 slides are a summary of the 375+ parent and community responses recorded since the BOE presentation on March 2, 2023.



THE TOP TEN TRENDS ARE LISTED BELOW WITH THE FIRST THREE BEING THE MAIN THEMES OF THE FEEDBACK


- 1. Concern High school going to school first instead of elementary school.
 (Feedback included studies linked to sleep needs for high school students versus elementary school students).
- 2. Concern Marching band practice in the morning. (Feedback pointed to loss of marching band practice time before school and the City of Olathe noise ordinance).
- 3. Concern Elementary start times too late for working family households.
- 4. Concern JCPRD availability and wait list. (Feedback pointed to a higher demand for JCPRD if elementary were to move later).
- 5. Concern Eliminating 20 minutes of instructional time at elementary/middle school levels. (Feedback pointed to both equitable staff contract times across the board as well as losing instructional time being detrimental to students).




THE TOP TEN TRENDS ARE LISTED BELOW WITH THE FIRST THREE BEING THE MAIN THEMES OF THE FEEDBACK (2)

- 6. Concern Staff contract times, especially staff who have children at elementary/middle
- 7. Concern Moving bell times for all when the bus schedule only affects 25% of families
- 8. Proposal Alternative options like eliminating pay rider service and/or the 21st Century Academy transportation services offered. (Feedback indicated parents would be interested in more exploration of these two options and their impact on both students and the transportation issues).
- 9. Proposal Early childhood being on the same schedule as elementary
- 10. Proposal Dropping DS Bus Lines and finding another busing company










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


2 MORE OPTIONS

 As a result of the feedback from parents and staff since the BOE presentation, we have two new options to share with the BOE.

Both have HS with a 7:40 start time















WHY NOT HAVE HS GO LAST?

- Many variables affect this...
 - HS average ride time is the longest (55min).
 - JCPRD support in the afternoon.
 - Athletic contests in the Sunflower League (more class time missed)
 - Limited options for after school employment for students (employers want 4-8 hours)
 - Significantly reduces or eliminates day shuttle (field trips) availability (9am-2pm)
 - Practice times for HS sports and activities (darkness in the fall/early spring)
 - Childcare help for younger siblings
 - Student drivers driving home during peak hours
 - Doesn't align with KS HS bell schedules
