Talk Moves

Let's discuss!

In-Person or with Safety Measures in Place

- 1. Talk moves are sentence starters to help students comfortably engage in conversation and to draw others into the conversation.
- 2. Talk Move sentence starters could be any of the following:
 - a. I would like to add on to what said . . .
 - b.I agree with ____ because . . .
 - c. I disagree with because . . .
 - d. This is true because . . .
 - e. I heard you say ...
- 3. The teacher can provide students with a list of Talk Move sentence starters on a card to use during the conversation.
- 4. The teacher could ask students to tally each time they use a Talk Move prompt in a group conversation.
- 5. This will help students self-monitor their use of Talk Moves and their level of engagement in a group conversation.

Online Learning

- 1. Talk moves can be used during Zoom discussions either whole group or in smaller groups using break out rooms.
- 2. Teacher can provide the Talk Move prompts using a card or slide accessed from their digital platform such as StudentVue, Google Classroom, Seesaw, Teams, etc.
- 3. These prompts can be referenced by students during their discussion.
- 4. Students can tally each time they use a Talk Move prompt to help them self-monitor their use of Talk Moves and engagement in a group discussion.
- 5. Another option is to use a virtual wheel set up with Talk Move prompts.
- 6. The teacher can utilize the wheel via screen sharing in Zoom.
- 7. Students then use the selected prompt during the discussion.
