### **Community-Based Therapists:**

Community based therapists, called Contract Therapists, are licensed mental health providers who provide therapeutic services in each school building, during the school day. These services are fee-based; the provider will provide information about their fees and whether they take insurance. Scholarships are available for families with financial need. Students may see Contract Therapists at their school or in the private provider's office during school holidays and Summer break.

## Summer Programs:

The HELP Clinic is open during the Summer break on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 9:00am-5:00pm. All services are free of charge. Check the Olathe district website in May for information on Summer Mental Health and how to make an appointment. Summer mental health programs are open to all Olathe Public Schools students, staff, and staff families.
