

Purify Videos With ViewPure


This site is VERY basic and not well-developed. Follow the instructions and it should work fine.

There is an opportunity to create an account, etc but there's no need to do this.

Copy the URL for your YouTube (or other type of video) that is on the web.

Access the ViewPure site: <http://www.viewpure.com>

Paste the copied video URL in the large box:
