Kansas Promise Scholarship Created by the state legislature, this program offers you the opportunity to apply for a scholarship covering tuition, fees, books and required materials if you major in certain academic programs (including elementary education). This program applies to freshmen and sophomores at JCCC and KCKCC.

Presidential Transfer Scholarship Awarded automatically after you transfer to Emporia State, this scholarship is based on your GPA and is renewable for a total of two academic years when you meet eligibility and renewal requirements.

Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) Scholarship | Awarded to active members of Phi Theta Kappa, this one-time scholarship is awarded as \$500 in the fall semester and \$500 in the spring semester after transferring to Emporia State with proof of membership.

Elberta Harris Scholarship Receive \$2,000 per year for two years when you enroll in ESU's elementary education program and meet credit hour and GPA eligibility requirements. This opportunity is only for students that graduated from a Johnson County High School.

FAST Grant Scholarship | Speed up graduation by one semester, student teach in Kansas City Kansas Public Schools and receive a \$5,000 scholarship to finance your education with this opportunity.

Kansas Teacher Service Scholarship Awarded through the State of Kansas, this program helps junior and senior college students by awarding financial assistance based on GPA and number of credit hours taken in exchange for working in underserved areas or disciplines (including elementary education) after graduation.
