- Flexibility during student teaching which allows students to work (individual circumstances may vary).
- Use of Go React technologies enables real-time and video classroom observations and evaluation.

- Professional academic advisors at K-State available to assist with transfer plan.
- Classes taught by K-State faculty with more than 1,000 years of K-12 teaching experience.

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Transfer Steps:

- Follow steps to apply: online.k-state.edu/how-to-apply Applying late fall or early spring is recommended for students want to enroll summer and/fall to complete the last four semesters of teacher education professional studies.
- Send ACT/SAT score to K-State . If no score is available, consult with K-State academic advisor.
- Submit FAFSA and apply for grants and scholarships outlined below. Don't delay!
- Send complete transcripts from all schools attended as soon as possible after application is submitted.
- Apply for admission to College of Education professional teacher education program. Requirements for admission to professional teacher education program: 2.75 GPA, C's in classes # listed on p. 1 and submission of ACT or SAT.
