NCAA/NAIA Eligibility

NCAA eligibility guidelines change often. It is the responsibility of the student athlete to ensure that they are meeting NCAA/NAIA eligibility requirements. More information about eligibility requirements and registering with the Clearinghouse can be found in the 2019-2020 Olathe Public Schools Program Planning Guide and the OSHS Counseling website. Even though it is the responsibility of the student to ensure that NCAA/NAIA eligibility requirements are being met, student athletes who plan to play college athletics or who are being recruited by colleges for athletics are advised to let their counselor and the Athletic Director Matt Johnson know of these intentions.

AP Exam Reminders

Enrollment for 2nd semester AP Government started on 1/13/2020 and will close on March 6 at 11:59 p.m. The cost of the exam is \$98. ALL STUDENTS have the opportunity to register for ANY AP Exam between now and March 6 but there will be a \$40 late fee which makes the total cost of the exam \$138. According to KSPA, each year, hundreds of students gain recognition for their journalism through the KSPA Regional Contests. Hosted at six universities, the contests challenge students to create their best writing, photography, design or cartooning. All students receive feedback from an expert judge and many receive awards for their work. Students who place at Regionals qualify for the State Contest in May where they can earn a state championship or other awards. Students can compete in two ways, digital submission and on-cite contests.

ACT Boot Camp - Summer 2020


This summer from June 8-11 there will be an ACT camp offered at Olathe South High School from 8 a.m. to noon and another camp offered from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. Additionally, there will be a camp offered from July 13-16 from 8 a.m. to noon. Each day students will spend time practicing and learning strategies for each section of the ACT under the direction of certified teachers in Language Arts and Math.

Students will get immediate feedback and individualized instruction as well as have the opportunity to focus on individual areas of weakness. Especially if students are signed up to take the June 13 or July 18 ACT, this would be an excellent chance to review and improve in the days before the test.


Performing Arts Department Stages Mamma Mia!
