The History of the Old Settlers

When I think of Old Settlers, I think of amusement rides, Grange pups, concerts and an all-around good time. But what most people don't know, is that Old Settlers is more than 100 years old. It started in 1877 as just a one-day gathering to celebrate and remember Olathe's history. The idea was put to action by the Old Settlers Association. The Old Settlers Association is still an active non-profit organization that meets to plan the Festival for 9 months of the year. The first Old Settlers gathering was very different from the one we have yearly now. People from all over the County gathered in a Shady Grove in Southwest Olathe, had a picnic, and formed The Pioneer Association of Johnson County, Kansas. Though, it wasn't adopted as an annual tradition until 1898 when a gathering of people sent out invitations in the newspaper and adopted the name "The Johnson County Old Settlers Association". I interviewed a Member of the Old Settlers Association, Pam Hall, and asked her lots of questions. Here is what she said:

Q: When did you join the Old Settlers Association?

A: 1996. That was 27 years ago. I have lived in Olathe all my life.

Q: Why did you want to join?

A: When I was a little girl, in 1951, I used to go to Old Settlers with my family.

Q: What was Old Settlers like back when you were a kid?

A: It's very different than it is now. I would babysit to get enough money to go on the rides. The High School band would perform. In the seventies it started to change more into how it is now.

Q: What is the Old Settlers Association like now?

A: There are only 26 people in the Association. The only event we organize is the Old Settlers Fair. There are different committees within the association and I am in charge of the Arts and Crafts committee. We start meeting in February and meet every month to plan the event.

Q: What's the hardest part of organizing the event?

A: The hardest part is setting up and packing up the fair.

Q: What's your favorite part of Old Settlers?

A: The people. I like seeing my family, and old friends. It's a celebration meant for Olathe to remember its heritage. It's a tradition that needs to stay.

How long has Oakley been a Therapy Dog?: "She was actually born for that job, and she was trained in Washington, Kansas at KSDS which is a dog training facility."

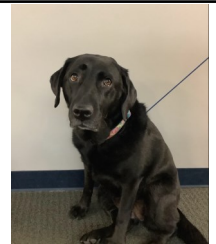

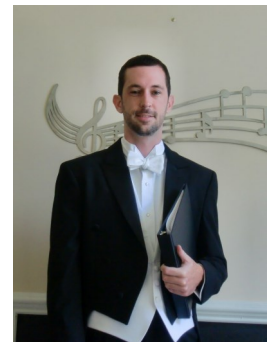

Refereeing Soccer as My First Job

Normally, you can't get a job until you're around 16, but here in Olathe, there is an option to earn some cash as an 11 year old kid. I first heard about Refereeing from my Soccer Coach. I really wanted cash so I signed up to Referee little kids for Rush soccer.

The sign up process was not difficult. There was a Ref meeting that I needed to attend just to sign up and get information about the league. And really that was it. The director gave me a whistle and some websites that I could learn the rules on. Refereeing for little kids is not all that hard. Before you go to the game, you just need to sign in at the Ref building in the middle of the fields and pick up a game card, which you use to write the score on.

For your Ref uniform, all you need is black shorts. You are the only Ref refereeing the game, but you are refereeing 5 year olds. The ages you can Ref are U6, U7 and U8 which are basically kindergarten through 2nd grade. The only thing the kids do is kick the ball out. So it's not too hard to make calls. What about getting paid? Refeing a U6 game earns you \$10 per game. U7 is \$11, and U8 is \$12. It's a great way to make money as an 11 year old.

But if you want more earnings, once you turn 12, you can get a Referee job for Heartland Soccer Association. I really wanted money to save up for a phone, so once I turned 12, I got right into becoming an Official Referee for Heartland. Refeing the bigger fields takes more than one Ref. There is one Center Referee and two Assistant Referees (AR) who stand on the side with a flag. The grades you can Ref are older, spanning from U7 to U18. And the wages are great! Refereeing a U7 game as an AR gets you \$17.50. And Refeing a U18 game as a Center Ref gets you \$50 dollars a game!

The sign up process was a bit more complicated than signing up for Rush. I had to sign up for a 5 hour Refer-

ee class that was mandatory to becoming a Ref. The class was mostly just listening, taking notes, and learning the rules of being a Ref. At the end of the class, we had to take a test. You could only get 6 questions wrong to pass. After a very long and boring morning, I passed the test! Once you pass, you are a Ref for 1 year until the new year, when, thankfully, you don't have to retake the class, you just have to take the test online again.

After I became an Official Ref, I needed a uniform. Heartland Refeing uniforms are more professional and you need more items in it. I ordered mine as a full set but you can just go out and find the things you need from any sports store. The uniform includes a bright-colored Referee shirt, black shorts, black socks, black shoes, a flag, a whistle, a yellow and red card, and your referee badge. Once you get all those things, you're good to go!

Every Referee gets emailed once a week to sign up for games. You have to fill out a form stating all the times you are available to Ref over the weekend and where. The two main soccer fields are the Garmin Olathe Soccer Complex fields and the Scheels Overland Park Soccer Complex Fields. All of the fields are numbered, so you shouldn't have a hard time finding your field. Once you get assigned some games (an email will be sent with the weekend game calendar) you report to the Ref office at the Soccer Complex and sign your name in. Then you're ready to Ref!

My first game as an AR was very nerve-wracking. AR's have to call who throws it in, goal kick or corner kick, and offside. It's hard making calls because no matter what you do, there's always a coach or parent criticizing you. And I know what to do if they take it too far (Get one of the Ref directors and get them to deal with it) but it's still scary. I don't enjoy refeing, but that's part of having a job. You may not always enjoy it, but you're still doing a job that is helping someone else.

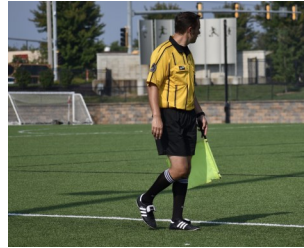

Softball was believed to be first developed from the game called Indoor Baseball. Indoor baseball started in 1887 when a crowd of people were gathered together inside the Farragut Boat club waiting to hear the Harvard vs. Yale football game. When they heard that Yale had won an excited fan threw an old boxing glove at one of the Harvard fans. That Harvard fan responded by swinging a broomstick at it. George Hancock, a reporter at the time suggests that they play a game of indoor baseball. He stitched together the old boxing gloves to make a ball for them to hit then he drew the bases and the mound. The result of the game was 41-40 and the start of a new sport.

Softball has had many different names throughout history, at one point it was called kitten-ball and up until 1926 it took on various names including Mushball, Pumpkin Ball, Diamond Ball, and Army Ball. In 1930 it was officially named Softball and became a sport enjoyed by many girls around the world.

Now for the less death defying parts of a rodeo. Team Roping and Barrel Racing are also very well known in the mid-west. Barrel Racing is a

timed horse race around an arena with three barrels. The arena is 130 feet wide and 200 feet long with the world record held by Hailey Kinsel at 13.11 seconds. Team roping is when a pair of cowboys/cowgirls are let into a pin on horseback, trying to restrain an animal by rope. Rodeo is a very exciting sport to watch but very dangerous to be in.

It's 1997 and a new website that will change the course of online communication is now available to you on your family desktop computer. SixDegrees. A social network service website that was the first of its kind. You would use it to communicate with friends and family members. While SixDegrees laid the foundation for all other social networking apps, it was shut down in 2001 because it failed to earn the money that was predicted.

Two other social networking websites were created in 2002, Friendster and LinkedIn. LinkedIn is a social networking website for business and employment-focused users that is still being used today. Friendster was similar to SixDegrees but shut down in 2015.

Myspace was launched in 2003 and was the most visited social media site for several years. On MySpace, you can chat with friends, make new friends, watch videos posted by other people, listen to new music, and post pictures. All through the 2000's it was one of the most popular ways to connect.

Then, in 2004, a new website was created, Facebook, that changed the course of social media. Mark Zuckerberg, a Harvard sophomore launched a social networking service designed originally to connect Harvard students which has spread to users all over the world. In 2005, YouTube was born. The first of its kind; it's a platform for creators to share videos all across the world.

Twitter came along in 2006. The first tweet ever posted was by one of the founders, Jack Dorsey, saying "just setting up my Twitter". More recently, in 2022, Twitter was bought by Multi-billionaire Elon Musk for 44 billion dollars. Musk changed the logo of a bluebird to a plain X and is trying to rebrand it as "X" though many still refer to it as Twitter.

Then in 2007, the most revolutionary piece of technology was released. The iPhone. A new mobile device with a flat screen and apps which included Calling and Texting. And, on the first iPhone, there was no app store. You couldn't download Subway Surfers or Roblox, all you had were a few basic apps. 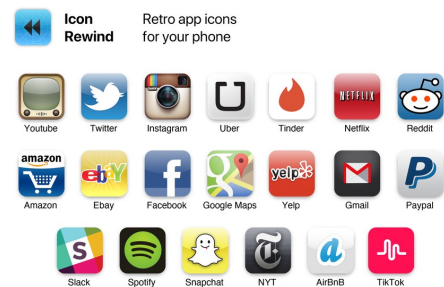

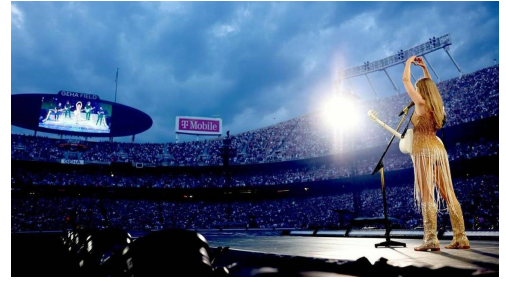

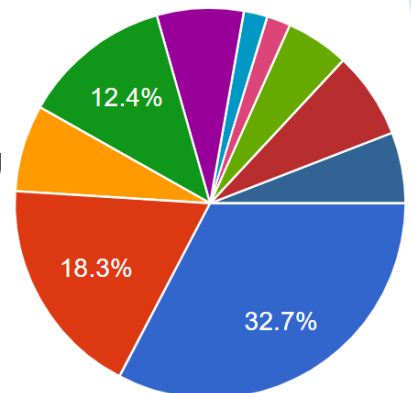

Oregon Trail's Favorite Artists

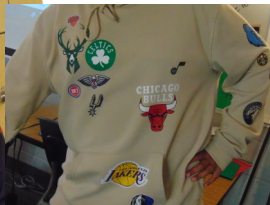
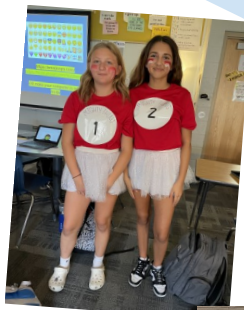

Since 1950, around 250 tropical storms have hit Florida giving Florida the record for State with the most Hurricanes/tropical storms. 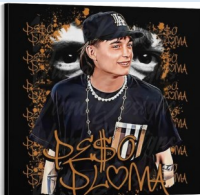

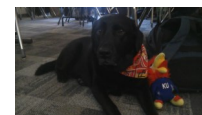

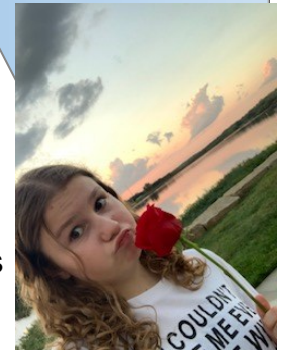
