Human Services Career Cluster Standards – Grades 9-12

The table below identifies the cluster standards specific to the Human Services Career Cluster – the collection of Fashion, Apparel, Interior Design (FAID) Pathway courses. These are the skills students are expected to acquire as they complete courses in this pathway.
